

**NOTICE OF ORDER**

**WILDLIFE AND COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1981**

**SECTION 53**

Cambridgeshire County Council  
(Public Footpath No. 14, Eaton Socon)  
Definitive Map Modification Order 2007

Notice is hereby given that the above referenced Order has been submitted to the Secretary of State for determination. An Inspector will be appointed by the Secretary of State to determine the Order.

The **start date** for the above Order is 27 March 2008.

Consideration of the Order will take the form of a local public inquiry.

The Inquiry will be held at **Jubilee Hall, School Lane, Eaton Socon, Cambridgeshire, PE19 8GW** on **Tuesday 19 August 2008** at 10.00am.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications will be to modify the Definitive Map and Statement for the area by adding to them the public footpath starting at the east end of School Lane at Ordnance Survey Grid Reference TL1728 5876, where it crosses a bridge over Colmworth Brook, and running in an easterly direction for approximately 80 metres with a width between 3 and 5 metres as shown on the order plan, to OSGR TL1736 5876, where it joins Public Footpath No 14, Eaton Socon. The order will also modify the Definitive Statement to record the width of public footpath No 14, Eaton Socon between OSGR TL 1736 5876 and OSGR TL 1741 5870 as varying between 2.5 and 21 metres as more particularly shown on the Order map.

**Timetable for sending in statements of case and proofs of evidence**

**Within 8 weeks of the start date - 22 May 2008**

The Order Making Authority must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after receiving it the Secretary of State will send a copy (excluding copies of any supporting documents) to everyone who has made an objection or representation and the applicant and any other person who has made a representation.

### **Within 14 weeks of the start date – 3 July 2008**

Everyone who has made an objection or representation and anyone who wishes to give evidence at the Inquiry must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the above date the Secretary of State will send copies to the Authority, the applicant, every other person who has made an objection or representation and any other person who has made a representation (excluding copies of any supporting documents).

Within the same period the applicant (if applicable) must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after receiving it the Secretary of State will send a copy to the Authority, everyone who has made an objection or representation and any other person who has made a representation (excluding copies of any supporting documents).

### **4 weeks before the date of the inquiry – 22 July 2008**

The Authority, everyone who has made an objection or representation, the applicant (if applicable) and anyone who wishes to give evidence at the Inquiry must ensure their proof of evidence (together with any summary) is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the above date, the Secretary of State will send copies of:

- i) the Authority's proof of evidence to everyone who has made an objection or representation, the applicant and anyone who has submitted a statement of case;
- ii) the applicant's proof of evidence to the Authority, everyone who has made an objection or representation and anyone else who has submitted a statement of case; and
- iii) all other proofs of evidence to the Authority and the applicant.

All parties must keep to the timetable set out above and ensure that statements of case and proofs of evidence are received by the Secretary of State on time. Late documents will be returned.
