

NOTICE OF ORDER

WILDLIFE AND COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1981 SECTION 53

Derbyshire County Council
(Byway Open to All Traffic from Nether Bretton to the
Road West of Broad Low -Parishes of Eyam and Foolow)
Modification Order 2007

Notice is hereby given that the above referenced Order has been submitted to the Secretary of State for determination. An Inspector will be appointed by the Secretary of State to determine the Order.

The **start date** for the above Order is **19 February 2009**.

Consideration of the Order will take the form of a local public inquiry.

The Inquiry will be held at **Tideswell United Reformed Church, Parke Road, Tideswell, Derbyshire. SK17 8NS** on **Tuesday 14 July 2009** at 10.00am.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications will be to modify the Definitive Map and Statement for the area by: -

Adding to them the Byway Open to All Traffic in the Parish of Foolow from Nether Bretton at Point A (Grid Reference SK 2031 7827) proceeding in a generally south easterly direction to the parish boundary at Point B (Grid Reference SK 2073 7792) then continuing in a generally south easterly direction in the Parish of Eyam to a road west of Broad Low at Point C (Grid Reference SK 2093 7771) a distance of 845 metres or thereabouts.

Any person wishing to view the statements of case and other documents relating to this Order may do so by prior appointment at Derbyshire County Council, County Hall, Matlock, Derbyshire during normal office hours from 09:00 am to 05:00 pm Monday to Friday (tel:- 01629 580000 extn.7241).

Statements of case/proofs of evidence will be available for viewing on The Planning Inspectorate's website at: www.planning-inspectorate.gov.uk as soon as possible after each of the following deadlines.

Timetable for sending in statements of case and proofs of evidence

Within 8 weeks of the start date 16 April 2009

The Order Making Authority must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send a copy (excluding copies of any supporting documents) to everyone who has made an objection or representation and the applicant and any other person who has made a representation.

Within 14 weeks of the start date 28 May 2009

Everyone who has made an objection or representation and anyone who wishes to give evidence at the Inquiry must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send copies to the Authority, the applicant, every other person who has made an objection or representation and any other person who has made a representation (excluding copies of any supporting documents).

Within the same period the applicant (if applicable) must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send a copy to the Authority, everyone who has made an objection or representation and any other person who has made a representation (excluding copies of any supporting documents).

4 weeks before the date of the inquiry 16 June 2009

The Authority, everyone who has made an objection or representation, the applicant (if applicable) and anyone who wishes to give evidence at the Inquiry must ensure their proof of evidence (together with any summary) is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send copies of:

- i) the Authority's proof of evidence to everyone who has made an objection or representation, the applicant and anyone who has submitted a statement of case;
- ii) the applicant's proof of evidence to the Authority, everyone who has made an objection or representation and anyone else who has submitted a statement of case; and
- iii) all other proofs of evidence to the Authority and the applicant.

All parties must keep to the timetable set out above and ensure that statements of case and proofs of evidence are received by the Secretary of State on time. Late documents will be returned.
