

NOTICE OF ORDER

WILDLIFE AND COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1981

SECTION 53

Derbyshire County Council
(Byway Open to All Traffic from Moor Road to Castlegate Lane - Parishes
of Great Longstone and Little Longstone) Modification Order 2008

Notice is hereby given that the above referenced Order has been submitted to the Secretary of State for determination. An Inspector will be appointed by the Secretary of State to determine the Order.

The **start date** for the above Order is 5 August 2009.

Consideration of the Order will take the form of a local public inquiry.

The Inquiry will be held at **Great Longstone Village Hall, Church Lane, Great Longstone, Bakewell, Derbyshire, DE45 1TZ on Tuesday 12 January 2010** at 10.00am.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications will be to modify the Definitive Map and Statement for the area by:

Adding to them the byway open to all traffic in the Parish of Great Longstone from Moor Road at Point A (GR SK 1967 7218) proceeding in a west south westerly direction to the parish boundary with Little Longstone at Point B (GR SK 1953 7213), a distance of 155 metres or thereabouts

And

Adding to them the byway open to all traffic in the Parish of Little Longstone from the parish boundary with Great Longstone at Point B (GR SK 1953 7213) proceeding in a north north westerly direction then in a north westerly direction to Point C (GR SK 1898 7282). Then proceeding in a generally west south westerly then west north westerly direction to Castlegate Lane at Point D (GR SK 1830 7283) a distance of 1,630 metres or thereabouts.

Timetable for sending in statements of case and proofs of evidence

Within 8 weeks of the start date [30 September 2009]

The Order Making Authority must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send a copy (excluding copies of any supporting documents) to everyone who has made an objection or representation and the applicant and any other person who has made a representation.

Within 14 weeks of the start date [11 November 2009]

Everyone who has made an objection or representation and anyone who wishes to give evidence at the Inquiry must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send copies to the Authority, the applicant, every other person who has made an objection or representation and any other person who has made a representation (excluding copies of any supporting documents).

Within the same period the applicant (if applicable) must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send a copy to the Authority, everyone who has made an objection or representation and any other person who has made a representation (excluding copies of any supporting documents).

4 weeks before the date of the inquiry [15 December 2009]

The Authority, everyone who has made an objection or representation, the applicant (if applicable) and anyone who wishes to give evidence at the Inquiry must ensure their proof of evidence (together with any summary) is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send copies of:

- i) the Authority's proof of evidence to everyone who has made an objection or representation, the applicant and anyone who has submitted a statement of case;
- ii) the applicant's proof of evidence to the Authority, everyone who has made an objection or representation and anyone else who has submitted a statement of case; and
- iii) all other proofs of evidence to the Authority and the applicant.

All parties must keep to the timetable set out above and ensure that statements of case and proofs of evidence are received by the Secretary of State on time. Late documents will be returned.
