

NOTICE OF ORDER

WILDLIFE AND COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1981

SECTION 53

Derbyshire County Council
(Two lengths of footpath from Mill Lane, Holloway to Footpath No 32 and
from Public Footpath No 32 to Public Footpath No 38 at the Cromford
Canal - Parish of Dethick, Lea and Holloway) Modification Order 2006

Notice is hereby given that the above referenced Order has been submitted to the Secretary of State for determination. An Inspector will be appointed by the Secretary of State to determine the Order.

The **start date** for the above Order is **25 June 2010**.

Consideration of the Order will take the form of a local public inquiry.

The Inquiry will be held at **Willersley Castle Hotel, Cromford, Matlock, Derbyshire, DE4 5JH** on **Tuesday 23 November 2010** at 10.00am.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications will be to modify the Definitive Map and Statement for the area by adding to them two lengths of footpath in the Parish of Dethick Lea and Holloway from Point A (GR SK 32494 56318) proceeding in a generally south south westerly direction to Point B (GR SK 32409 56122) a distance of 219 metres or thereabouts. The second length being from Point C (GR SK 32359 56123) proceeding in a generally south westerly direction, then in a generally north westerly direction then generally westerly direction turning to a generally southerly direction finally turning to a generally south westerly direction to Point D (GR SK 31635 55609) a distance of 1126 metres or thereabouts.

Any person wishing to view the statements of case and other documents relating to this Order may do so by appointment at County Hall, Matlock, Derbyshire, DE4 3AG during normal office hours.

Timetable for sending in statements of case and proofs of evidence

Within 8 weeks of the start date [by 20 August 2010]

The Order Making Authority must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send a copy (excluding copies of any supporting documents) to everyone who has made an objection or representation and the applicant and any other person who has made a representation.

Within 14 weeks of the start date [by 01 October 2010]

Everyone who has made an objection or representation and anyone who wishes to give evidence at the Inquiry must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send copies to the Authority, the applicant, every other person who has made an objection or representation and any other person who has made a representation (excluding copies of any supporting documents).

Within the same period the applicant (if applicable) must ensure their statement of case is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send a copy to the Authority, everyone who has made an objection or representation and any other person who has made a representation (excluding copies of any supporting documents).

4 weeks before the date of the inquiry [by 26 October 2010]

The Authority, everyone who has made an objection or representation, the applicant (if applicable) and anyone who wishes to give evidence at the Inquiry must ensure their proof of evidence (together with any summary) is received by the Secretary of State. As soon as possible after the deadline, the Secretary of State will send copies of:

- i) the Authority's proof of evidence to everyone who has made an objection or representation, the applicant and anyone who has submitted a statement of case (excluding copies of any supporting documents – although none should be submitted with a proof of evidence);
- ii) the applicant's proof of evidence to the Authority, everyone who has made an objection or representation and anyone else who has submitted a statement of case (excluding copies of any supporting documents – although none should be submitted with a proof of evidence); and
- iii) all other proofs of evidence to the Authority and the applicant (excluding copies of any supporting documents – although none should be submitted with a proof of evidence).

All parties must keep to the timetable set out above and ensure that statements of case and proofs of evidence are received by the Secretary of State on time. Late documents will be returned.
